

ANNEX VIII

SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR THE PRODUCTION OF SHORT ANIMATION FILMS

1. Applicants and beneficiaries

1.1. Independent authors and producers who are currently registered with the Register of Cinematographic Companies may apply.

1.2. Beneficiaries may be independent producers who are currently registered with the Register of Cinematographic Companies.

2. Applications

The preparation of the application will include the following elements and information:

- a) Graphic presentation of the project (characters and environments);
- b) Full script accompanied by a storyboard sequence corresponding to a minimum of 1 minute or a complete storyboard;
- c) Information memorandum of the techniques to be used;
- d) Declaration of intentions of the film-maker, on the thematic, narrative, technical and artistic aspects which s/he considers to be relevant, up to 5,000 characters;
- e) Contracts or sufficient authorizations with the authors of the project, the film-maker and the eventual author of the existing work, in respect of the respective adaptation for cinema, in conformity with the provisions in the Code of Copyright and Related Rights;
- f) Registration in the IGAC;
- g) Budget and foreseeable financial structure of the project;
- h) Curriculum of the authors of the work;
- i) Curriculum of the film-maker;
- j) Other elements which the applicant considers relevant;
- k) Curriculum of the producer, as per the Register of Cinematographic Companies Cinematographic;
- l) Certificates proving that the applicant has no outstanding debts with the tax authorities and social security.

3. Criteria of selection and respective application

In the evaluation of the projects, the jury will apply the criteria established in article 19 of Decree Law no. 227/2006 of 15 November, specifically:

- A – Innovation and originality of the project;
- B – Narrative qualities of the project;
- C – Plastic coherence in the combination of the artistic elements.

4. Weighting coefficients

The final classification of each project is obtained by the application of the following formula:

$$CF = (A + B + C) / 3$$

5. Decision to grant the support of the ICA

5.1. Within the period of 30 days from the notification of the final ordered list resulting from the classifications awarded by the jury, the applicants of the projects indicated by the latter should deliver to the ICA:

- a) Indication of the producer, when the application is presented by the author, attaching a document from the former in which s/he states that s/he agrees to produce the project within the terms presented to tender;
- b) General information on the project, specifically the structure of the coproduction, as relevant, indication of the stages de production, laboratories, studios and other technical establishments planned, final format, expected duration and language(s) in which the work is spoken;
- c) Budget in line with the form established by the ICA;
- d) Financial structure;
- e) Curriculum of the co-producers not subject to registration, if any;
- f) Co-production contract(s), if any;
- g) Strategic operational and dissemination plan of the work;
- h) Contracts celebrated with the author(s), film-maker, and the eventual author of the existing work in respect of the respective adaptation for cinema, in conformity with the

provisions in the Code of Copyright and Related Rights (if they have not been presented previously).

5.2. Within the maximum period of 20 days after the deadline for the delivery of the documents referred to in the previous line, the ICA will set the amount and conditions of the support, consulting the producer, the film-maker, the jury and, when necessary, specialised consultants.

5.3. Within a period of the same length, as from the date of presentation of the proposed financing presented by the ICA, the producer should indicate whether s/he accepts or rejects the proposed financing.

5.4. The ICA's decision becomes definitive upon ratification by the member of the Government responsible for the area of Culture.

5.5. Within a period of 60 days after the date of ratification, the contract between the ICA and the producer will be signed in accordance with the wording approved by the ICA and which will obligatorily include the following elements:

- a) Script;
- b) Budget;
- c) Financial structure.

6. Payments

6.1. Payment of the financial support will be made in accordance with the provisions in the contract, notwithstanding the following:

- a) Payment of the support will be made after approval by the ICA of the elements set out in the financial execution form sent by e-mail;
- b) In no case may more than 10% of the amount of the support be paid by the ICA unless the accounts of the amounts previously received in connection with the project have been presented;
- c) The period of time between the date of receipt of each payment and the presentation of the respective accounts must not exceed three months;
- d) A minimum of 5% will be paid upon the delivery of the elements referred to in point 6.2;
- e) 5% after of the delivery of the final accounts of the production, signed by a chartered accountant.

6.2. The payment referred to in line d) of point 6.1. depends on the presentation and approval of the following elements:

- a) Two synchronous copies in the format contracted and one copy in DVD;
- b) Authorization to make an intermediate positive;
- c) Trailer for use in the promotion and dissemination of the work by the ICA;
- d) Synopsis (maximum 250 characters);
- e) Distribution contracts, if any;
- f) Broadcasting and publishing contracts, if any;
- g) Dialogue list of the film, if any;
- h) Contract celebrated with the respective composer, if there is original music;
- i) List of musical compositions;
- j) Batch of photographs of the filming representative of the film in digital format, for use in the promotion and dissemination of the work by the ICA;
- k) 3 Posters and copies of other promotion material produced.

7. Public exhibition

The works supported may not have their commercial début nor public exhibition without the prior delivery to the ICA of the synchronous copies referred to in line a) of para. 6.2.
